



UKULELE LESSONS AT ST. MICHAEL'S

St. Michael's Episcopal is proud to announce private ukulele instruction to all grade levels K-5 in our after school enrichment program located in the St. Michael's (room TBD). The lessons are offered through the **Uke 'n' Roll** program (www.ukenroll.com), which was featured in USA Today and will be taught by professional ukuleleist, **Samson Trinh**. Ukulele is fun and easy to play. It is a wonderful way to introduce children to the joy of playing a musical instrument. Here are the details:

The cost for a series of 13 private lessons is \$390.00 (once a week, \$30 for a half hour lesson) and students will need to purchase Uke 'n' Roll's lesson and song book for \$17.99 (total: \$407.99). Spaces for lessons are limited. **To enroll, contact Samson at 804-467-6182 to choose either a Tuesday or Thursday afternoon slot and best available times (please limit request to two choices)**. Samson will do his best to accommodate your request. After scheduling has been confirmed, Samson will send a link where parents can make payments online. Parents must contact Samson in advance if lesson needs to be rescheduled. Deadline to enroll is **September 9**.

Makala Soprano Ukulele MK-S \$85.99

The smallest and most popular size. Perfect for players with small hands and fingers.

Makala Concert Ukulele MK-C \$99.99

Preferably for players with larger hands and longer or wider fingers. The instrument has a longer neck with more and wider frets.
