



PHYSICAL EDUCATION, HEALTH & WELLNESS FELLOWSHIP

St. Michael's Episcopal School is offering a Physical Education, Health & Wellness Fellowship for the 2018-2019 academic year. This is a part-time, ten-month position (approximately 5 hours/week).

The Teacher's primary responsibilities will be as follows:

- Assist the Physical Education teachers with Middle School PE classes, which are held Monday-Thursday afternoons (approximately 2-3 p.m.)

There is an opportunity to expand the role (and earn additional compensation) by:

- Serving as a lead or assistant coach for one- three seasons.
- Planning and facilitating after-school enrichment activities for students.

The ideal candidate will have...

- a love of working with children and those who work with children;
- a minimum of 2 years' experience as a teacher/caregiver/counselor and/or as an athletic coach for students ages 10-15;
- an educational philosophy which places students at the center of the learning process, fostering students' curiosity, love of learning, and character development;
- the skills and experience necessary to effectively manage student needs;
- work actively to perpetuate an inclusive learning environment and support a school community grounded in empathy, social responsibility, and appreciation and respect for individual differences;
- a bachelor's degree in education or a related field is preferred, but not required.

St. Michael's Episcopal School provides children with superior academic instruction in an environment that acknowledges and develops the Christian values of kindness, respect, acceptance, integrity, responsibility, resilience, and compassion. The K-8 co-educational community is small enough (375 students and 48 faculty-staff) for everyone to know one another, and large enough to provide rich curricular and co-curricular opportunities. Its student-teacher ratio is 11:1, and average class size 18 to 19 students. The Middle School is located on a stunning 70-acre campus. In fall 2018, [the Lower School will move](#) into a brand new building on this campus. Students hail from 30 different zip codes. Founded in 1957, St. Michael's is accredited by the Virginia Association of Independent Schools (VAIS) and a member of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS). St. Michael's values diversity as an important element of serving its mission and thus considers applicants for all positions without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, age, marital or veteran status, disability, or any other legally protected status.
