



PART-TIME EXTENDED DAY TEACHER POSITION

St. Michael's Episcopal School seeks a qualified part-time After-School Care Teacher in Extended Programs for the 2019-2020 academic year. This is a ten-month position reporting to the Director of Extended Programs.

The Teacher's primary responsibilities will be as follows:

- Assist the Director of Extended Programs in delivering a program that serves the School's mission and meets state regulations pertaining to child care and extended day centers, including those for religiously exempt schools.
- Provide an environment for students K-8 that ensures students are happy, healthy and actively engaged after the school day has ended. This includes 3-6 p.m. on regular school days and 12-6 p.m. on early dismissal days.
- Plan and facilitate after school enrichment activities for students.
- Communicate effectively with students' families and faculty regarding program details and individual student needs.
- Ensure accurate tracking and reporting of student attendance for billing purposes.

The ideal candidate will have...

- a love of working with children and those who work with children;
- a minimum of 5 years of experience as a teacher/caregiver/counselor in extended day, after-school, and/or summer program;
- a clear understanding of best practices in the area of extended/auxiliary school programs;
- an educational philosophy which places students at the center of the learning process, fostering students' curiosity, love of learning, and character development;
- the skills and experience necessary to effectively manage student needs;
- work actively to perpetuate an inclusive learning environment and support a school community grounded in empathy, social responsibility, and appreciation and respect for individual differences;
- a bachelor's degree in education or a related field is preferred, but not required.

St. Michael's Episcopal School provides children with superior academic instruction in an environment that acknowledges and develops the Christian values of kindness, respect, acceptance, integrity, responsibility, resilience, and compassion. Located on a stunning 70-acre campus, our K-8 co-educational community is small enough (375 students and 48 faculty-staff) for everyone to know one another, and large enough to provide rich curricular and co-curricular opportunities. Our student-teacher ratio is 10:1, and average class size 18 to 19 students. Students hail from 30 different zip codes.
