- a minimum of 2-5 years of experience as a teacher/caregiver/counselor in extended day, after-school, and/or summer program; (nanny experience in a private household applicable)
- a clear understanding of best practices in the area of extended/auxiliary school programs
- an educational philosophy which places students at the center of the learning process, fostering students' curiosity, love of learning, and character development; (outdoor education experience preferred)
- a bachelor's degree in education or a related field is preferred, but not required
