MIDDLE SCHOOL SCIENCE TEACHER POSITION (Full-Time)

St. Michael's Episcopal School seeks a qualified full-time middle school science teacher for the 2024-2025 academic year. This is a ten-month position beginning in July.

The successful candidate will have...

- excellent verbal and written skills, and ability to communicate effectively with students, parents and colleagues;
- a minimum of 3 years experience teaching science, preferably in middle school; and
- a bachelor's degree in education, science, or a STEM-related field. An advanced degree is preferred, though not required.

The position's primary responsibilities will be to:

- teach science to middle school students which might include physical, chemical, life, and Earth science;
- create, plan, and teach an elective course during the school day;
- direct/coach school activities/clubs/sports as background provides, participate in school life through co-curricular activities -- with particular weight toward Robotics or similar programs;
- be available for multiple duties during carpools, morning break, and recess;
- serve as a middle school advisor.

The ideal candidate will have...

- used a variety of instructional strategies and assessment methods to meet the cognitive and affective needs of all students;
- worked cooperatively with colleagues on a consistent basis;
- integrated technology effectively into student learning;
- demonstrated kindness, enthusiasm, a sense of humor, and a passion for supporting children as they grow and learn;
- invested in continued learning and professional growth;
- worked actively to cultivate an inclusive environment and support a school community grounded in empathy, social responsibility, and an appreciation and respect for individual differences;
- employed effective classroom management skills;
- mentored middle school-aged students to support their academic and social-emotional growth;
- demonstrated success in significantly growing students' capacity to be curious about and investigate via the scientific process the world around them;
- maintained accurate and timely documentation of grades, behavior, academic concerns, and parent communication;
- experienced learning and teaching across a variety of scientific contexts including physical, chemical, life, and Earth sciences.
